Phase 1: Understanding the current situation

Consultations conducted with 60 organisations –
= Varied & incomparable data on SEAH captured
& reporting/analysis vary from 1 organisation to
another

Organisations collect
incomparable SEAH data, report
some or none publicly
→ No aggregated data analysis
possible & no real understanding
of SEAH

Phase 3: Scaling up a centralised system

Agreement on final SEAH framework
Objective to closely work with orgs/donors to
align & increase members for more trends
analysis & learning

Organisation collect the same
set of data on SEAH
→ Quality trends analysis
possible to inform evidence-
based policy & actions for more
prevention & risk mitigation

Phase 2: Testing

Framework designed & tested by various organisations
& reviewed by key stakeholders (ex. Donors) to identify
the best way forward for harmonisation

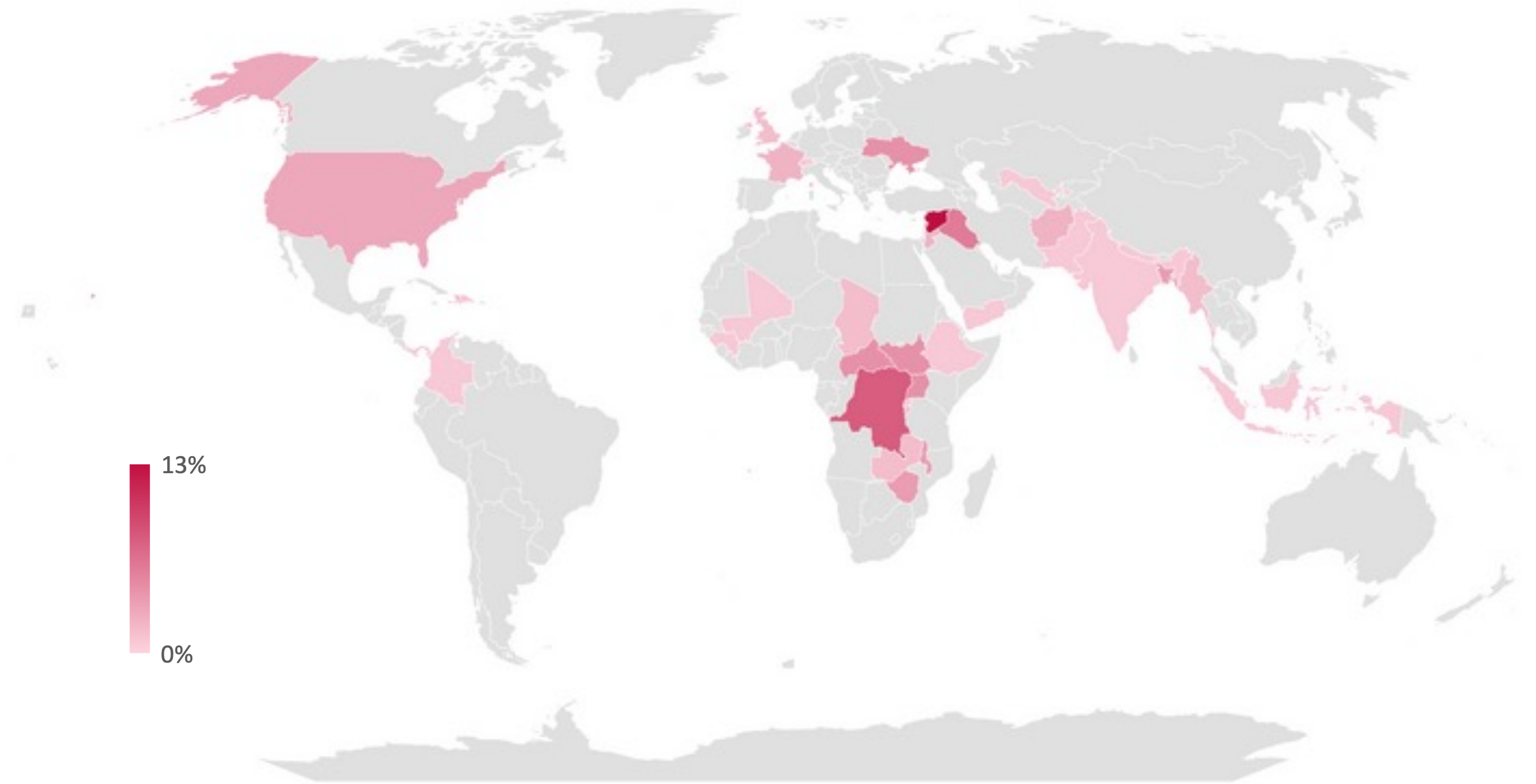

PROFILE OF VICTIM/SURVIVORS

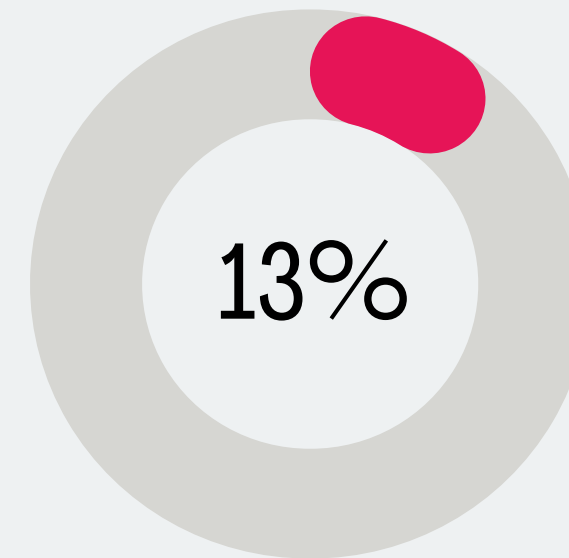
MAJORITY = FEMALE (84%)



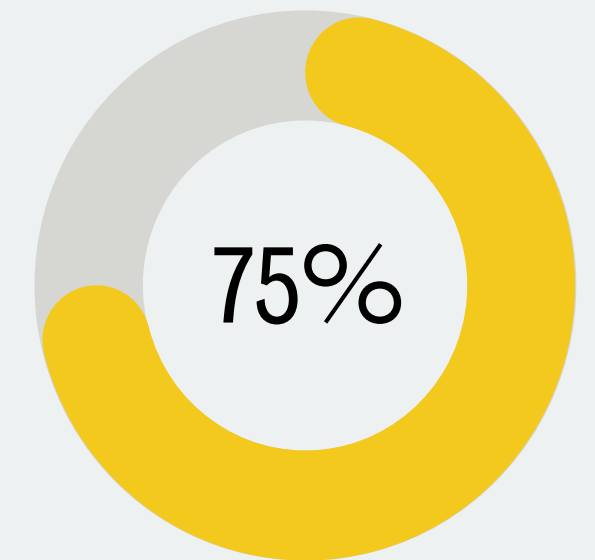
1/5 IS A GIRL UNDER 18

- **GIRLS** = most at risk of SA & SE
- **BOYS** = most at risk of SE & SA

TRENDS

ACTIONS TAKEN: RESPONSE

SEXUAL EXPLOITATION	<i>Less frequently</i> SUBSTANTIATED - <i>Most frequently</i> INCONCLUSIVE
SEXUAL ABUSE	<i>Most frequently</i> SUBSTANTIATED
SEXUAL HARASSMENT	<i>Most frequently</i> UNSUBSTANTIATED

Peer to peer learning and capacity building

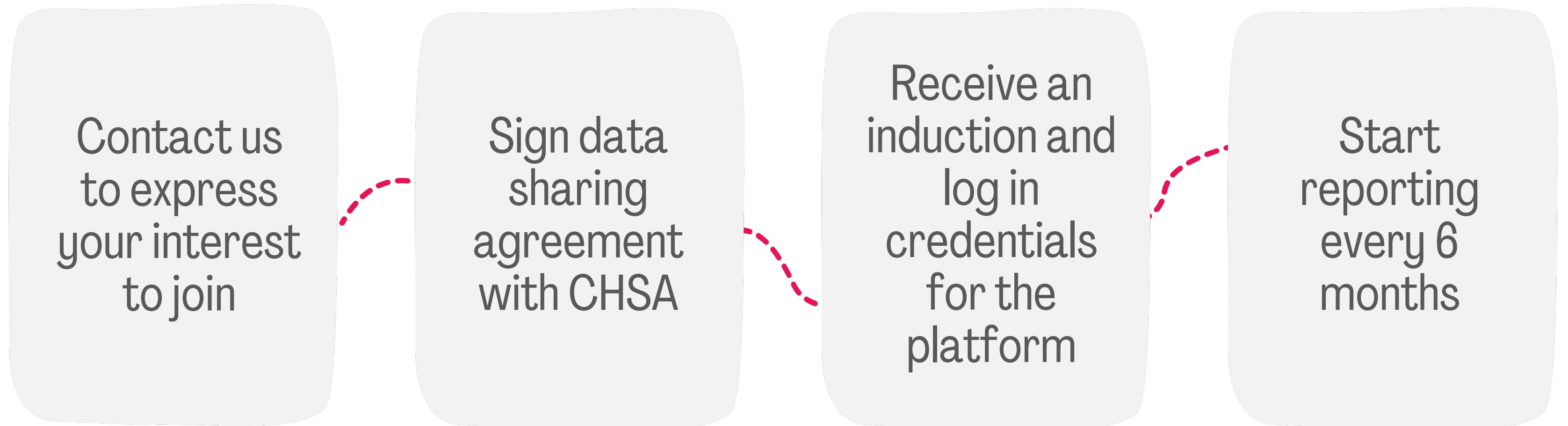
WHAT IS EXPECTED FROM SCHEME MEMBERS?

WHAT → Report **non identifiable** data on SEAH incidents

HOW → Using the **agreed-upon data fields** and into the SEAH
Harmonised Reporting Scheme **online platform**

WHEN → Every **6 months**
