




SEAH HARMONISED REPORTING SCHEME (HRS)

The infographic is based on 169 incidents reported by HRS participating organisations over 6 months, detailed in our Analytical report. These figures are not representative of the total SEAH incidents or SEAH prevalence in the aid sector. However, such figures provide a valuable foundation for understanding key issues and identifying effective starting points for intervention.
