He currently serves as the Executive Director of Forum for Community Upliftment System Nepal (FOCUS-Nepal), a nonprofit organization based in Dhading, Nepal. Under his leadership, FOCUS-Nepal has implemented transformative programs in Water, Sanitation and Hygiene (WASH), Livelihoods, Disaster Response and Management, Natural Resource Management, Gender Equity and Social Inclusion, Community Health, Education, and Peace-Building, positively impacting thousands of rural households.

Mr. Chhatkuli is widely respected for his ability to bridge local expertise with regional and global networks. He has held key leadership positions including Chairperson of NGO Federation Nepal–Dhading and Board Member of the Disaster Management Network Nepal. Internationally, he contributes as a Global Tandem Leader, member of the NEAR Network, and core member of the Asia Pacific Localization Lab, where he plays a pivotal role in promoting localization, advancing regional funding, and fostering collaboration among civil society organizations.
